Annotational issues:

Mutual manufacturers do have a complete other sorting-order or Annotation to catalog their products. In order to keep track of the enormous amount of products/types/product-numbers, the major/primary identification of the CALCUSEUM-database does skip most Non-Alphanumeric Tokens/Chars (like - , = .), but also spaces.

Examples:

Calculator CASIO model 101-A is cataloged as CASIO: 101A Calculator OLYMPIA CP 140 is cataloged as OLYMPIA: CP140

Instructions SHARP 7M0.5T(TINSM3832CCZZ) is cataloged as SHARP_docu: 7M05TTINSM3832CCZZ

Nixie-tube part RODAN GR-111Pa is cataloged as RODAN_parts(E): GR111Pa

PCB (Printed Circuit Board) CASIO 12H-12(C) is cataloged as CASIO_parts(E): 12H12C

Exceptions:

When the removal of the special character(s) results in a confusing syntax, for example: PRIVILEG: LC10-8M remains PRIVILEG: LC10-8M (PRIVILEG: LC108M would lead to a wrong conception).

AKA (Also Known As):

In addition, each Item in the Database is also identified by its AKA (notification somewhere on the item, usually the front) AND... its AKA Label (notification on the label of the item, usually on the back).

Examples:



Front AKA = personal-mini



Label on back

AKA Label = personal-mini, CM-607

Primary Database-notation = CASIO: CM607

Nr.:
